#### From the Desk of Rabbi David Wise Idiot America



In this month's installment of The Rabbi's Nightstand, where I reflect

on the books I read for leisure, let's delve into a book that has nothing to do with Judaism, but is just as easily applied to the question of the future of Judaism. The book is Idiot America: How Stupidity Became a Virtue in the Land of the Free, by Esquire political columnist Charles Pierce. First, a disclaimer: I didn't read this book as a liberal or a conservative, but as a fan of great writing, of which Pierce is a master. At times laugh-outloud funny, often scathing in its critiques, Idiot America questions why actual knowledge and expertise has become outmoded in the United States.

Pierce identifies the three great premises of Idiot America: (1) Any theory is valid if it sells books, soaks up ratings, or otherwise moves units; (2) fact is that which enough people believe. Truth is determined by how fervently they believe it; and (3) anything can be true if someone says it loudly enough. In taking the reader on a tour of the Creation Museum in Kentucky, where you can sit on a



AM YISRAEL CHAI --- AM YISRAEL CHAI -- THE PEO-PLE OF ISRAEL LIVE

This is what I want to scream out to the world, as I watch the horrific slaughtering of innocent people in Paris. To think that you can be strolling through a supermarket shopping for Shabbat and all of a sudden, you are face to face with a terrorist pointing a gun at you with eagerness to kill you. To think that you can be sitting at a meeting in your office and two gunmen storm in and start shooting. I ask myself...How can this be? How can human beings hate so much that they are gratified to massacre people (Jews and non-Jews alike)? It is INCOMPREHENSI-BLE!

During this time of terror, I learned that France has the largest Jewish population in Europe and the third largest Jewish population in the world (after Israel and the United States). The Jewish community in France is estimated at about 500,000. However, the overwhelming rise of anti-Semitism and terrorist acts against the Jews in France are causing tremendous fear. Therefore, many are deciding to move to Israel. It's easy to understand why!

The Jews of France are a diverse and strong group. They contribute to business, culture, science and many other aspects of society. It is interesting to note that one of the most acclaimed French Jews. Rabbi Shlomo Yitzchaki, known as Rashi (ירש"י), was a medieval French Rabbi and author of a comprehensive commentary on the Talmud and the Tanach. Praised and celebrated for his unique ability to present the basic, concise & coherent meaning of the text, Rashi's works remain a cornerstone of contemporary Jewish study. His commentary on Chumash is relied upon as an indispensable aid to students of all levels.

As so many did, I watched the Unity March that took place in the streets of Paris, with our very own Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu helping to lead the way. I saw the President of France, Francois Hollande, join Bibi at the Grande Synagogue in Paris and I was filled with emotion and pride. We, the Jewish people, are but a mere speck of sand, in terms of our numbers. We are less than 0.5% of the world population. Yet, the Jewish people and our State of Israel are always on the forefront, leading, revolutionizing, spearheading, guiding and transcending. We are survivors in the truest sense of the word! We are determined to thrive and to grow and to never be destroyed, no matter how hard some may try.

dinosaur with a saddle and Adam has been neutered. Pierce shows the reader how the lines between legitimate expertise and a pundit's wacky platform have been blurred. Whether it's a discussion of teaching "Intelligent Design" in the public schools, or the Terry Schiavo end-of-lie circus, or climate change, Pierce laments the elevation of blustery nonsense to an equal, if not greater, level of legitimacy. His signature quote, by a pastor from Pennsylvania weighing in on the public school question, sums it up: "We've been attacked by the intelligent, educated segment of our population."

How does this relate to Judaism? As a passionate advocate for living a meaningful Jewish life, I put learning at the center. Simply put, the number one threat to the American Jewish future-and the future of the Jewishness of the State of Israel, for that matter-is Jewish literacy. We will not survive on bagels and lox alone. We must know something about our tradition in order to commit to extending it, educating not only the next generation but the current one, ourselves, as well.

Do Pierce's Three Great Premises apply to Judaism? Well, what sells Jewish books? Go to Barnes and Noble and see what's on the Judaica shelves. A significant percentage of the books are related to what I call the New Kabbalah. Now while I have great respect for authentic study of Jewish mystical literature, I'm no fan of the Kabbalah Center, whether it's in New York, Los Angeles, or elsewhere. It's lovely that Esther Madonna has taken an interest in Judaism, but do we really applaud the capitalization on classic Jewish thought for ulterior motives? Authenticity is not defined by popularity. No matter how many books it sells, how fervently it's believed, and how loudly it's broadcasted, it's not necessarily authentic.

One of my favorite Jewish books is Back to the Sources, a collection of essays meant to introduce serious adult Jewish learners to the classics of Jewish text. And the key word is serious. I think everyone should read it. At the Schechter Long Island "Night of Jewish Learning," the keynote speaker, Rabbi Elie Kaunfer of Mechon Hadar, said that all elements of Jewish life-Torah, sacred service, and acts of hesed, should be content-rich and challenging. Not unachievable, but challenging. Friends, if it comes too easily, it isn't worth it. We're not idiots. We aren't afraid of the "intelligent, educated segment of our population." In fact, that's exactly what we should strive to be!






