### From the Desk of Rabbi David Wise White Trash



As an immigrant to this country, I have tried to make myself knowl-

edgeable about American history. What I, like probably everyone was taught, was that America was founded by people who fled religious persecution and economic hardship in Europe, and built a society in which merit would determine success. Such a system is in place to this day, and anyone can make it. That's the American dream.

Since the 2016 election, I've been trying to understand America better. Previous columns in this space have included my thoughts on books such as Hillbilly Elegy and The End of White Christian America. For this edition of The Rabbi's Nightstand, I want to share my thoughts about a brilliantly researched and deeply discomfiting book. It's called White Trash: The 400-Year Untold History of Class in America, by Nancy Isenberg, a professor at Louisiana State University.

Isenberg argues that class has always been a feature in the life of our nation, even in its gestational stages. Many of the

"Angel of the Ghetto" shares the incredible story of Sam Solasz, his extraordinary journey of courage and resourcefulness and his unwavering determination to survive. Sam's story is a true inspiration. While witnessing unimaginable hatred and inhumanity, Sam found the strength and bravery to escape, survive and live on. It was in the Bialystok Ghetto that Sam Solasz became known as "The Angel of the Ghetto." He would sneak in and out of the Ghetto multiple times each day, risking his life to find food and anything else that might help him and others. He ultimately jumped from the speeding cattle car train that was transporting him and his family to Treblinka, running as fast as he could to the forest while being shot at. How he finally made his way to America, you will read in the book. He and Rose met in 1956 while ice-skating at Madison Square Garden and with Rose, Sam found a new start. Sam is now sharing his story with the entire world. Over the years, I have spent many hours sitting and talking with Sam and hearing about his incredible journey. I am always glued to his every word and in awe of his tenacity. With Rose, Sam created a beautiful life filled with family, goodness, love, community and

people who first came to these shores were the "undesirables" of Britain; they were shipped here as excess population. The founding fathers recognized that future offspring of these lower-class White Americans would be a drain on the country's resources, so it would be preferable to focus energies on bolstering a higher class of American. In his Notes on the State of Virginia, Jefferson wrote: "The circumstances of superior beauty is thought worthy in the propagation of our horses, dogs, and other domestic animals; why not in that of man?" Isenberg traces the role of class in the Civil War, the Age of Eugenics, the Great Depression, and LBJ's Great Society. And she presents what she titles The White Trash Makeover, with attention paid to Tammy Faye Bakker, the Carter and Clinton presidencies, and the meteoric rise of Sarah Palin.

In her epilogue, Isenberg poses a challenging question about the repeating reaction to attempts to improve the lives of the persistent White underclass. "As she cast her eyes upon southern trailer trash in the middle of World War II, the *Washington Post* columnist Agnes Meyer asked, 'Is this America?'

""Yes, it is America. It is an essential part of American history. So too is the backlash that occurs when attempts are made to improve the conditions of the poor...In the larger scheme of things, the modern complaint against state intervention echoes the old English fear of social leveling, which was said to encourage the unproductive. In its later incarnation, government assistance is said to undermine the American dream. Wait. Undermine *wh*ose American dream?" (p. 312)

In my view, what Isenberg is doing with America is remarkably Jewish. She is challenging us to struggle with our assumptions about the origins, present, and future of America. We may describe ourselves as a City on a Hill, but we have a long way to go to achieve that merit. It's not only race that we need to grapple with, it's class. "Americans not only scrambled to get ahead, they needed someone to look down on." Those people, quite frequently, were given derogatory group names, the most recent of which is "White Trash." The book of this same name should force us to wonder why it is so. Just as we Jews are mandated to improve upon our world for the benefit of all, we American Jews should take seriously the state of our country, and how we can make the American dream more than mythology.






