From the Desk of Rabbi David Wise Israel 2018 In the Flesh



As you read these words, we will have just recently celebrated the

50th anniversary of the unification of Jerusalem. Yom Yerushalayim is a day set aside for gratitude every year, but especially so on this special milestone. I wish I could have been there to join in the festivities.

Now, try to imagine what it would be like to be in Israel for Yom Ha-atzmaut. Israel's Independence Day, in 2018, for the 70th anniversary of the establishment of the State of Israel. That will surely be an extraordinary event, right? So I have some great news to share: you don't have to imagine what that will be like; you can actualize the experience. I am thrilled to announce formally a threesynagogue visit to Israel for that great celebration, April 15-25, 2018. Along with Rabbis Robyn Fryer Bodzin of ICCJ and Manes Kogan of Hillcrest JC, I am thrilled to be leading HHBJC on a once-in-a-lifetime kind of trip.

The trip is tailored for a diverse population, with peak experiences for both *halutzim*—firsttime Israel visitors—and *vati*-

This past week I was part of the *Cantors Assembly*'s (CA) 2017 Convention. This year the CA celebrates its 70th anniversary and its members are steadfastly committed to keeping the Art of the Cantorate alive and even stronger than ever. We had hundreds of Cantors in attendance.

I was so pleased to see so many newly ordained Cantors from across the U.S. and Canada who are new members of the CA, as well as many Cantors-To-Be who are still in school...all committed to preserving the art and legacy of the Cantorate by leading services in their congregations with the traditional Cantorial sounds and motifs. These young Cantors gave me the peace of mind and confidence that through their leadership and roles as Cantors, they will ensure the survival of not only the Cantorate but our Jewish tradition.

I was also impressed and so proud by so many of the newer Cantors who expressed to me that they have been concentrating on bringing participatory music to their synagogues and are receiving so much positive feedback from their congregants about how much they love and appreciate singingalong. They thanked me for sharing my music with them, which really all started here in Hollis Hills with all of you as the first to hear and sing my compositions. In fact, my music books are part of the Cantorial text/curriculum at schools today and have become a part of many Cantors' repertoires. One of the highlights of this convention was a beautiful YOM YERUSHALAYIM CONCERT as Yom Yerushalayim was celebrated the week of the convention.

By the way, last week I was home relaxing after some dental work and I had the opportunity to watch a very moving film on one of the Jewish networks. It is called "Left Luggage". It stars many well-known actors; Chaim Topol, Maximilian Schell. Isabella Rossellini. Jeroen Krabbe and others. It is about a Jewish man in Antwerp, Belgium who buried 2 suitcases in the ground filled with family possessions and memorabilia, while escaping the Nazis. He survives the Holocaust, as did his wife, and the movie is about his struggles with his memories and trying to find the "left luggage" as well as his daughter's story. I must warn you that there is a tragic side to this movie but one of the things I learned from the film was how different people deal with their memories and experiences of the holocaust in different ways and no way is the 'right' way, it is up to each human being to deal with tragedy,

kim, those who've been before. For example, while newcomers to Israel visit *Yad Vashem*, Israel's memorial to the Holocaust, returnees will visit *Ketef Hinom*, an archaeological site on the grounds of the Begin Center, where the oldest Biblical text ever found was discovered! There will be unending somethings for everyone on this trip.

What's more, we will have the dual emotional experiences of *Yom Hazikaron*, when the nation grieves its fallen soldiers and victims of terror, and *Yom Ha-atzmaut*, when sadness turns to joy and gratitude. We will join Israelis in their communities to take in the range of emotions, seeing both the costs and benefits of the War of Independence. Then we'll have Shabbat in Jerusalem, which is an incomparable, Jewish-life-changing day!

Since we participants come from three Conservative synagogues, we'll also see vibrant portraits of *Masorti* Judaism in Israel in communities such as Ashkelon and Kibbutz Hanaton. And on *Yom Ha-atzmaut*, we will pray and sing together at *HaKotel HaMesorati*, the space designated for egalitarian worship in Jerusalem's Old City. It promises to be a powerful service of thanksgiving!

We at HHBJC will be hosting an information session with the three rabbis and ITC Tours, our trip operators, on Wednesday, June 21 at 8 pm. We'll be there to encourage you to join us and to answer your questions. You can see details about itinerary and pricing on flyers at shul and on our website.

You've likely noticed that in my excitement to promote the trip, I haven't said anything about books. Since I usually use this space for reflections on my recent reading, allow me to strongly urge you to read about Israel this summer to gear up for the 70th anniversary year. As I've said many times, my personal favorite is Like Dreamers by Yossi Klein Halevi, which tells the story of the paratroopers' unit that conquered Jerusalem in the Six Day War and then represented the complex diversity of Israeli political thought in the aftermath of the war. It's a crucial look into what Israel struggles with and strives for, and is required reading for anyone interested in Israel, as all Jews should be. Every individual/ family that signs up for the trip will get a complimentary copy of Like Dreamers as an expression of my gratitude. But I hope that you're enticed by more than a free book. I hope that you'll see how Yom Haatzmaut 5778/2018 will be extraordinary when celebrated by you, in the flesh, in the land, touching Jerusalem's stones with your own hands.

<u>Ohr Chadash News</u> Farewell to Ohr Chadash By Ruth Merrill

It is almost impossible to believe how quickly the school year passed. I know, we all think that every year, whether we are students, parents, teachers or the Education Director. It was less than ten months ago that staff positions were finalized, books were ordered and the arduous registration process was underway. Now as I look back and remember all that was accomplished this year, I realize that once again, the school year truly flew by.

Our Pre-Pesach Seder was a huge success. The children and their guests had a wonderful time recalling and retelling the story the exodus of the fledgling Jewish nation from Egypt. Each class was assigned a portion of the Hagaddah and presented it. Kitah Gimel had everyone smiling and singing along as they sang "Let My People Go." The children analyzed and explained the Four Sons and everyone, both young and old, joined our youngest classes as they sang the Ma NIshtanah-- the Four Questions. For Karpas, we all dipped our celery into salt water and ate Hillel sandwiches of Matzah. Maror and Charoset. Nut free charoset, with dates instead of nuts. was served to our children with nut allergies. The children of Mechina followed the Seder using their individual personalized Hagaddot. The class made them as their yearlong project. Thank you to Morah Shari for catering the meal, Morah Zehava for leading

the Seder and our dedicated teachers for coming in early or staying late to make sure the event ran smoothly and efficiently.

The children of Kitah Dalet, as part of their yearlong Holocaust studies project under the guidance of Morah Judy, presented a program for the school on Yom haShoah. The children read poems and essays to the school and parents. Claire Heymann, a member of ICCJ and a 92 year old Holocaust survivor spoke to the children about her experiences in Auschwitz and other camps. The children and adults sat and listened in awe as she reminded all those present to never forget. Later that day, many of these children attended the community wide Yom haShoah commemoration. It was very moving to hear these young people read poems written over seventy years ago that are still relevant today. A special thank you to Morot Shari and Judy for being there for the children all day.

Sunday, May 7, was one of the happiest days of the year. The students of Kitah Aleph received their first Siddurim. After singing select prayers and expressing their feelings about this special

Rabbi Dr. H. Joseph Simckes Life After Retirement

"The Man Who Mistook His Wife For a Hat" vs "The Continent That Mistook the Entire Jewish People for the Devil"

In 1985, Dr. Oliver Sacks, renowned neurologist, wrote his charming book, "The Man Who Mistook His Wife For A Hat", a brilliant collection of challenging case histories, highlighted by the uproarious story of a husband who suffered from the not-sofunny cognitive dysfunction, "visual agnosia" a very discombobulating medical malfunction "not due to a loss of visual acuity, memory, language or low intel*lect*". Due to this neurological affliction he mistook his accurately perceived image of his marital partner for a hat!

Fifty odd years earlier, physicians, politicians, political pundits, historians, academics, jurists, social scientists, ethicists and other members of the world's elite class of "Intelligencia" were hard put to precisely identify the specific malady that had begun to plague the entire continent of oldworld Europe, from Berlin to Brussels, Munich to Milan, Nuremberg to Nice, Wurzburg to Warsaw, Arnhem to Amsterdam: namely, the vicious, ruthless, mindless malady of anti-Semitism.

In certain overly simplified ways, that nasty European malady resembles Dr. Sacks' later case history of visual agnosia. How? Neither were the result of "loss of visual acuity, language, memory or low intellect". The facts are incontrovertible. The supersophisticated, highly educated Germans and their Austrian, Lithuanian, French, Polish, Norwegian, Ukrainian, Dutch and other assorted European partners committed mass murder, vile torture, theft, pillage and rape on a scale & intensity never seen before or since. Their illegal, monumental immoral behavior defies classification.

"Visual agnosia" is relatively easy to classify. Just ask Dr. Sacks. Why do you suppose so many of the few Jewish survivors of the Shoah were unable-and some are still unable-to even talk, speak or put into words what happened in the death camps, gas chambers and barbarous death puts of Eastern Europe? Why? Because there are no word capable of describing the indescribable. Our human vocabulary has no adequate lexicon for actualized hell on earth. Photographs may multiply visual data-on a thousand to one basis!but what camera yet invented can record the anguish of the soul? What memoir can fully encapsulate that which words cannot fully explain?

In 1933 the National Socialist Party ("Nazis, for short!) were voted into power in central Europe and soon thereafter its doctrines of racial superiority/ inferiority & the insidious notion of "German Master Race" destined to rule the world & cleanse it from all forms of ethnic filth and disgrace (i.e. Jews, Gypsies, homosexuals) came into vogue.

As a professor at a respected, local Catholic University (St. John's), I can accurately cite 2000 years of Christian theological propaganda, scandalously identifying Jews as deicides, parasites, deniers of authentic spiritual truth, engaging in monetary fraud, ethical misconduct, a people worthy of isolation, humiliation and disgrace for rejecting the teachings and practices of the glorious human/divine Christian Savior. Clearly, that 2000 year old Christian message was a powerful, potentially contributing variable to WWII and even to the slaughter of 6,000,000 Jews and millions of other innocents. But does that explain it?

The medical abnormality, "apperceptive or associative visual agnosia", however, is caused by very specific malfunctions in the posterior occipital lobes of the brain. Trained medical researchers have given us definitive proof of this clear, unambiguous clarification. However, how do we explain anti-Semitism? What parts of the brain are responsible for the despicable, multi-tentacled moral madness i.e. Judeophobia, that gripped and, in not so subtle ways, still infects the entire continent of Europe...and beyond into the Middle East, Africa, South America and parts of Asia?

On an immediate level, how can we explain the ongoing current wave of this same deadly malady, i.e. Jew-hatred, masked nowadays as BDS, i.e.*Boycott, Delegitimization ,and Sanctions* of the national Jewish state of the Jewish people, Israel, by so many government officials, college professors, students, movie stars, rock singers, etc who run to the press and TV cameras to make their fallacious claims?

How would any rational observer (from another objective planet, let's say Mars) define the vesuvial volumes of lave-density defamation flowing daily from the Security Council of the world's so-called

civilized nations, headquartered in the pious, hypocritical halls of the U.N. for these past 69 years?

As the warmer days roll in, may I recommend for your summer reading Raul Hillberg's "The Destruction of the European Jews", Daniel Goldhagen's "Hitler's Willing Executioners", Antony Beevor's "The Second World War". There are thousands of other similarly fine texts on this subject available also. Choose one. You may even decide to reread Erich Fromm's classic, The Art of Loving". Why? Because Fromm, the master psychologist from Frankfurt, wrote this small masterpiece based on his experience of the Holocaust. Why did he pick love as his theme? Because, apparently, that was one of the keys to understanding the dynamics of the Shoah, the missing ingredient that enabled hate to flourish.

Our rabbinic sages understood this truth. That is why they selected *The Shmah as our most fundamental Jewish Prayer*. Because it's first opening statement affirms *"V'ahavta...Thou Shalt Love!"*

Friends, I began this article with the odd invitation to view the vast question of European anti-Semitism through the tiny prism of *"visual agnosia"*. Why? To tickle your intellectual curiosity. I hoped to intrigue you into taking on the far more substantial challenge of seriously investigating this subject, one of the most demanding, bewildering issues confronting mankind. Why do people hate? Why does injustice, misery and pain enter our lives in so many ways and for so many days, decades, centuries of senseless suffering?

Why did our Bible begin the Torah by splattering its open pages with blood? Why did the first human family have its serenity shattered by the first human child ever born on earth choose to murder his brother? Are violence and blood-lust actually built into our human DNA, making us all potential infectious diseasecarriers of mutual hate? Tough questions, eh? It's easier to begin with the problem of "visual agnosia" and European anti-Semitism, eh?

In any event, stay healthy, relax when possible and explore new possibilities for personal growth.

Take pride in the fact that on May 4, 2017, Pres. Donald Trump issued an executive order promoting free speech and religious liberty! No longer would rabbi's, ministers and priests-or imams for that matter-have to worry about the IRS or any other agency of government pursuing them for bringing truth to power, for expressing what to some government officials might seem politically incorrect. Rev. Martin Luther King Jr. suffered such U.S. government harassment 50 years ago, never again. The Johnson ruling restricting rabbis and all other spiritual leaders from challenging government policies was now a thing of the past.

By the way, some members of our congregation may recall when in 1989 Chana and I and a small group of friends from HHJC went to the Soviet Union...to smuggle into Russia contraband Jewish prayer books, Chumashim, Shofort, etc. to help our Jewish brothers and sisters to practice their faith in an evil empire where religious liberty did not exist. Weeks after our mission the Berlin Wall fell. Such missions, Baruch Ha-Shem, are not required in America!
