From the Desk of Rabbi David Wise Concealment and Revelation



Why do we dress up in costumes on Purim? Some say that

though God plays a role in the miraculous rescue of the Jews, God is hidden from the stage of history—concealed in costume, as it were. Or maybe it's because Esther (whose name in Hebrew is similar to seter, secret or hidden) hides her Jewish identity in the palace harem. Or it's because of the general upside-down conclusion to the story-venahafokh hu—in that Haman ends up hanged on the very tree he prepared for Mordechai, and the Jews, targeted for annihilation, end up ascendant.

Whatever the reason, when dressing in costume, one is saying, "See me as something other than what I am." For this issue of *The Rabbi's Night-stand*, I want to reflect on two books I've read recently, both of which are stories of concealment, but for very different reasons.

The first is *The Angel: The Egyptian Spy Who Saved Is-rael* by Uri Bar-Joseph, a political science professor at the University of Haifa. It tells the story of Ashraf Marwan, the



enigmatic son-in-law of Egyptian president Gamel Abdel Nasser, and one of the most important spies in Israeli history. Bar-Joseph's contention is that Marwan provided Israel with intimate knowledge of Egypt's military plans, but was ignored by at least one influential voice in the Israeli intelligence hierarchy, and was later painted as a double agent who deceived Israel. In The Angel, Bar-Joseph provides ample evidence and other voices from Israel to show that were it not for Marwan's last-minute communications, the initial damage that Egypt inflicted on Yom Kippur 1973 would have been far worse.

Here was a member of Nasser's innermost circle, a supposed Egyptian patriot, selling secrets to his country's avowed enemy. Why would Marwan do this? Bar-Joseph mentions the conventional wisdom among students of traitorous espionage, but suggests that Marwan was motivated primarily by money and ego, the latter of which needed to be fed by the exhilaration of risk-taking behavior. "His behavior included a need for stimulus, which often drives people to take risks, whether physical or emotional. Some people take up rock climbing, skydiving, or bungee jumping. But Marwan was not drawn to the sporting life...the act of betraval itself gave Marwan a sense of adventure that his stormy psyche desperately needed" (p. 32)

The second book that tells of concealment is The Underground Girls of Kabul by Jenny Nordberg. The book is an expansion of her research into the phenomenon in Afghani society of the bacha posh, the girl temporarily raised and presented as a boy. Given the emphasis on boys in this and other cultures, the inability to produce boys (or worse, the births of girl after girl) is a source of shame for families. So in this book, we meet a number of girls who are sent to school as boys and, commonly, are accepted as boys until puberty dictates that they switch back to their birth sex.

Nordberg introduces us to a variety of bacha posh, most notably Azita, who served a term in Afghanistan's parliament representing a distant rural province and is raising her youngest daughter as a boy. We see how she navigates gender in a country where she has lived in different climates: in cosmopolitan Soviet-era Kabul with dreams of becoming a doctor; in poverty as an illiterate man's second wife, during her term in government and after she loses her seat in a clear case of election fraud. And we learn that she herself was raised as a bacha posh, until her well-connected father arranged her marriage. In Azita and others in *The Underground* Girls of Kabul, we find a form of resistance to the Afghani patriarchy. "Most bacha posh...

have paid dearly for living as boys, and their circumstances were rarely chosen. But once they found themselves on the other side, they fought back. And it was noted. So can a story of concession and resistance, of tragedy and hope, exist at the same time? For women, it always has" (p. 300).

On Purim, we conceal ourselves for the thrill of it, like Marwan, but also as a form of resistance. And when we return to public view as ourselves, as Jews, we should emerge with greater confidence in our true identity. It's fitting that one month after Purim, we have Pesah, which we first observed by painting our doorposts with a mark that identified us as Israelites. The intended audience of that symbolic expression wasn't God, for God didn't need to look for our mezuzot to determine if we were Jews. Commentators say that during the Exodus, we painted the inside part of the doorpost so that WE would know who we are. Now, we put the mezuzah on the outside-concealed in costume no longer.
