### **The Vote and Israel**



In your list of voting priorities, where does a candidate's position

on Israel rank? If this policy outlook is important to you, then the immediate challenge is to determine what the candidate really feels about Israel. And that's not always easy to do, given the difficulty of finding an unfiltered interpretation of a candidates' stated position.

That's why one of my recent reads, and the subject of this month's issue of *The Rabbi's Nightstand*, is a book by Bar Ilan University's chair of the political science department, Jonathan Rynhold. The book, *The Arab-Israeli Conflict in American Political Culture*, tracks current trends in American politics through the lenses of party ideology and faith. It's a data-based study that doesn't fall prey to emotional analyses. It's sober, but it doesn't need to be sobering, for like Dennis Ross in his book *Doomed to Succeed*, which I reviewed in this space a few months ago, Rynhold is secure in his belief that America will always be a loyal ally to Israel. In his own final words: "...the underlying cultural foundations of pro-

Israel sentiment in America are so robust that the special relationship between Israel and the United States will remain virtually unbreakable" (p. 188)

That's the easy part. Particulars of party and religious outlook aside, Israel will always be closely allied with the US, regardless of who sits in the Oval Office or holds a majority in the House. Now comes the hard part—determining how a candidate's ideology and even faith will color his or her attitudes toward Israel. This next paragraph describes the intersection between American identity and feelings about Israel, and may help explain why some think that party affiliation determines one's outlook. Rynhold writes:

"Indeed, the Arab-Israeli conflict evokes such passionate debate precisely because it touches on core elements of American identity. Thus, for liberals, sympathy for Israel is rooted primarily in the American creed, specifically Israel's identity as a democracy. Because liberalism is at the core of that creed, they expect Israel to live up to those values...On the other hand, while Conservatives also support Israel because it is a democracy, they give greater weight than liberals to the place of Israel in the ethno-religious dimension of American identity..." (p. 182)

Rynhold notes a significant difference in pro-Israel attitudes between evangelical Christians and mainline Protestants. For

example, citing a 2012 Pew Research Center study, 67 percent of Evangelicals "sympathize with Israel over the Palestinians," compared with 47 percent of Mainliners. What are the religious roots of such a discrepancy? For Evangelicals, "a sense of being biblically commanded to support the Jewish people coupled with a sense that support for Israel is linked to biblical prophecies about the end times undergird that support" (p. 114). On the other hand, for some Mainliners, anti-Israel sentiment is informed by a variety of religious influences, such as Liberation theology, which celebrates Jewish exile and does not allow for Jewish national self-determination (p. 129). But, Rynhold notes, the anti-Israel faction of Mainline Protestant denominations is not even in sync with their clergy and the mainline public. Besides, their numbers are dwarfed by the Evangelicals.

These theological issues may explain why some Jewish voters struggle to identify with certain candidates for office, be it for President or other elected positions. What if we're entirely in sync with a candidate's domestic policy, but wonder about his/her pro-Israel bona fides? What if we know a politician is staunchly pro-Israel, but find his/her domestic platform anathema to our values? Rynhold's book won't solve those inner conflicts, but it can help us understand the impact of

ideology and faith on attitudes to Israel, and make us more informed voters.

May all who vote choose with wisdom and inspiration!

Shalom! Now that the cool days of fall are upon us, and we have celebrated the High Holy Days, we are looking forward to another year of exciting events with the Sisterhood.

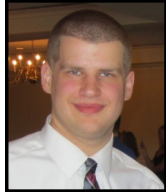
Our paid-up membership brunch was a great success. Everyone enjoyed good food and hearing Maris Blechner speak.

### **A Yarn About Yarn By Rebecca Reich**

To use an old-fashioned term I am going to tell you a yarn (story) about yarn.

Our hat project began over two years ago. We have made hundreds of hats, our crafters are wonderful. I was prompted to start the project when my cousin's grandson signed up, because he felt it was the logical course of action after the September 11<sup>th</sup> attacks. We began our project with hats for soldiers; they are not only for warmth but also for comfort under the helmets they wear. The synagogue paid for the yarn, our crafters provided the hooks, needles and labor and a member paid for much of the shipping to the charities who see the hats get delivered to the soldiers. 8

We expanded to include tiny hats for children in a local hospital NICU after two of our grandchildren spent some time in the NICU (Neonatal Intensive Care Unit). Anyone who has ever walked into one of those units knows what it feels like in the pit of their stomach when they see those little babies and how much it helps seeing the tiny hats made by volunteers that give the babies some individuality. Our initial yarn was donated by a grandmother whose latest grandchild was a girl – everyone kept asking for something other than pink for hats.
