From the Desk of Rabbi David Wise The Lion's Den



In this climate of intense partisan polarization, I have spoken several

times about the need for each side on the political divide to hold their fellow travelers accountable for missteps. On the subject of Antisemitism, this has been the call of Deborah Lipstadt and Bari Weiss in their important and influential books. In this month's issue of The Rabbi's Nightstand, I want to draw your attention to a book that does the same on the subject of Zionism. That book is The Lion's Den: Zionism and the Left from Hannah Arendt to Noam Chomsky, by Susie Linfield.

Linfield teachers cultural journalism at NYU, and was an editor at The Washington Post and The Village Voice. She places herself firmly in the camp of the left. She is also deeply attached to the idea of Zionism and the State of Israel, and she is not hesitant to be critical of Israeli governmental policy. But in this study of 20thcentury intellectual history, Linfield is not hesitant to critique the blind spots of core leftist thinkers in their writings about Israel. "The Left has spent a lot



He has worked with some of the world's leading conductors, including Zubin Mehta, Roger Norrington and Gary Bertini. Rafi studied Chazzanut with leading Chazzanim in Israel, the UK and the US and is now himself a teacher of many young Chazzanim. Cantor Frieder was a very dear friend of Mordechai Sobol and has worked very closely with him for many years.

of time and intellectual energy trying to solve the Jewish Problem—but it also has one" (p. 9).

Arendt and Chomsky are the most familiar of Linfield's subiects, but I learned a lot about the thinkers she studies in the interim chapters. They are Arthur Koestler, Maxime Rodinson, Isaac Deutscher, Albert Memmi, Fred Halliday, and I. F. Stone. All of her subjects except for Halliday were Jewish, and all were deeply anticolonialist and advocates for socialism (and even Marxism). Linfield scoured the complete collection of all of her subjects' output on Zionism and Israel, and her thorough familiarity enables her to point out contradictions in their writings. She also is not shy about pointing out where a thinker's statement of certainty conflicts with indisputable facts. Her long opening chapter on Arendt ends this way: "Arendt's Zionist writings are a model of the pitfalls into which so many commentators of Israel fall: arrogance, ignorance, remoteness, abstractness, and the tendency to see the country, and its conflicts, as a replication of previous histories rather than as uniquely themselves. Arendt never acknowledged these shortcomings; she was not one to admit she was wrong. But [in a letter she once wrote], her words could have served as a fitting self-assessment: 'People ignore reality in favor of their bright ideas" (p. 79).

Linfield's most reverent chapter is reserved for Albert Memmi, the Tunisian Jewish intellectual and anti-colonialist, who supported Tunisian independence but was then forced out of his homeland because of his Jewishness and Zionism. He expected that Israel would become "a secular and socialist beacon" (p. 195). He vocally opposed the Occupation. But he did not consider it Zionism's existential flaw. Linfield seems in step with Memmi as she writes: "The establishment of a Jewish state has not, of course, vanquished anti-Semitism. How to interpret this failure? For [Maxime] Rodinson, it proved the foolishness of Zionism's basic goal. For Memmi, the opposite was true. The hatred directed at Israel—from its Arab neighbors, from the Western Left, from anti-Semites on the right—proved the Jewish state's necessity" (p. 191).

Linfield stakes out a strong position of her own on Zionism, and expresses dismay over the current state of Israeli politics. But instead of writing a book about her counterparts on the other side of the spectrum, she looks inside her own house, as it were, and calls out illogic and inaccuracies where she sees them. In an era when many writers are loathe to be so introspective, this kind of selfreflection is refreshing. As we enter the New Year, a season that calls for introspection and self-reflection. The Lion's Den is a model for such honest thinking.
