From the Desk of Rabbi David Wise Just Kids



It was a time of great upheaval, and two young adults were

trying to not only find their place in this evolving world, but to shape it with their art. He drew; she wrote poetry. They had almost no income, barely scraping by, but they had each other—supporting each other's dreams and pushing one another's creative boundaries. Yet to the outside world, they were nothing—for now.

The writer-in-training later described a lazy day spent people -watching in Washington Square. Soon, they too were being watched. "We were walking toward the fountain, the epicenter of activity, when an older couple stopped and openly observed us. Robert enjoyed being noticed, and he affectionately squeezed my hand.

"'Oh, take their picture,' said the woman to her bemused husband, 'I think they're artists.'

"Oh, go on,' he shrugged. 'They're just kids.'"

From this dismissive reaction came the title of the poet-turned-performer's first book, and the subject of this month's

issue of *The Rabbi's Night-stand*. Patti Smith, inductee in the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame, took decades to follow through on her promise to her former boyfriend but constant collaborator, Robert Mapplethorpe, to tell the story of their rise to artistic fame. When she did, she called the book *Just Kids*.

Reviews called her memoir "achingly beautiful," and I certainly concur. Elements of the end product of Patti's and Robert's journey are joyous. They each find love and professional acclaim—she as a poetvocalist, he as a provocative photographer. The journeys and struggles are at times heart-wrenching, and Robert dies of AIDS at 43. Smith never stops loving him, and credits her success to his faith in her. "Just Kids begins as a love story and ends as an elegy."

The title made me wonder how much greatness has been stifled by the words "they're just kids." Right around the same time that Patti and Robert were expressing the hopes of their generation, Jewish students descended upon the General Assembly of the Council of Jewish Federations. That was 1969, and those young Jews changed organizational Jewish life in America for good, and for better—even though many thought of them as "just kids."

Jewish tradition has long recognized the transformative capacity of young people. The Talmud says: "The world exists by virtue of the breath of small schoolchildren who study the in elementary schools" (Bavli Shabbat 119b). You've seen me emphasize the profound meaning of the Torah of our youngest students, our preschoolers, when they share their commandments on Shavu'ot. Let's remember that young people are often change agents. We don't always appreciate their energy and passion. We say they're inexperienced, naïve, and misguided. In other words, "they're just kids." But let's not let perceptions of their youth obscure their wisdom.

We're just a few weeks from 5777—a New Year. Not everything "new" is necessarily "improved," but neither should it necessarily be threatening. Maybe beneath the surface of those kids, artists are waiting to be discovered!



December 11th we are going to have a Hanukkah Gift Shop bazaar and party. We hope to see you all there perusing the goods.


Our annual Sisterhood Shabbat will be held January 14th. It's never too early to start thinking about the parts you want to participate in.



Rabbi Dr. H. Joseph Simckes Life After Retirement

<u>The Hashemite Kingdom of</u> <u>Jordan and Israel's Future</u>

This past summer, the Jordanian Ambassador to Israel, Walid Obeidat, in the presence of Israel's President, Reuven Rivlin, celebrated in Tel Aviv's stunning Panorama Hotel the 100th anniversary of Jordan's successful revolt against the Ottoman Empire back in the heady days and nights of WWI (June 10th, 1916). Ambassador Obeidat pointed out that the Jordanian national flag, among other symbols, contains a seven pointed white star in its center, representing the seven opening verses of the Koran which call for "faith in one G-d. humanity, humility, virtue, social justice and aspiration". These seven principles, Obeidat affirmed, were the basis of Jordan's whole-hearted and apparent robust cooperation with Israel in today's pursuit of regional peace.

Israel's President Rivlin followed Obeidat with lavish official praise for Jordan's confrontation with today's multichallenges "with pronged honor and dignity and great national and human solidarity of a strong and moderate state, whose moderation comes not from weakness but from strength."* Surely, the other surrounding Moslem states in the Middle East have much to learn from Jordan's current pro-Israel stance. The overwhelming majority of American citizens and law-makers agree

with this current display of Jordanian-Israeli cooperation.

Sadly, in the past, in defiance of Israel's request to Jordan NOT to join the Arab coalition pledged to annihilate Israel after the U.N.'s vote to welcome the Jewish State in 1947-8, Jordanian troops attacked Jerusalem, bloodily captured the Old City, destroying at least 50 synagogues therein, stealing hundreds of tombstones from the centuries-old cemetery on the Mt. of Olives, using them to pave roads, build Moslem buildings, bathrooms, etc. These despicable desecrations violated all accepted international standards of decency, reflecting the sordid anti-semitic ethos rampant in the Arab world ever since the Grand Mufti of Jerusalem left British mandatory Palestine with 1000's of his followers to join Hitler's killing squads alongside Nazi troops in WWII.

For years, Jordanian snipers sat on the ancient walls of the Old City, shooting and killing daily innocent civilians in the New City of Jerusalem! That is a sad, shameful fact of 20th century history. Geo-political wisdom, however, cautions mature Israeli leaders today to put aside that fact and focus instead on the current Jordanian movement towards cooperative relations with Israel.

It is in Jordan's best interest to have a strong Israel protecting its flanks from Jihadi elements within and without its borders, intent on overthrowing the present royal Jordanian government and replacing it with a radical Islamic junta. It is in Jordan's immediate interest to have Israel, it's immediate western neighbor, a country free and dynamic, stable and progressive, scientifically advanced and economically bustling, as a friend and ally. Modern Israel, militarily nimble and muscular, stands as a reliable bulwark protecting an independent, pro-western Jordan from an Isis- led coup d'etat.

Israel and America are similarly bonded -- (forever, we pray!) - based on a much deeper level of sharing: a common Judeo-Christian heritage of monotheism, political democracy, freedom, personal dignity and a Scripturally- rooted ethical code.

Jordan, as presently constituted, is a most welcome and respected partner in regional Mid-East and global peacemaking.

QUESTION: Is the Palestinian Authority, however, equally and finally- ready to set aside its self-destructive political partnership with Radical Islamist groups, (i.e. Chamas, Hizbollah) and once and for all sit down and engage in serious face-toface discussions with Israel? Is it even capable of engaging in deception-free diahonest, logue, open agenda-sharing, compromise, cooperation and re-imagining of itself and of Israel?

Land swaps are not the key... but mind-changes and con-

structive attitudinal shifts! The real bridges to peace are mutual trust based on verifiable acts of good faith. When nations take pride not only in their own uniqueness but in each other's differences and demonstrate respect for each other's varying tastes, reasonable necessities and comfort zones, peace is attainable.

Today's Jordan is a model of "tikvah", i.e. hope that decades of hostility and deceit, bloodshed and rejection, will be replaced by shared journeying towards a common future, potentially over-flowing with the milk of authentic friendship and the honey of shared social, cultural, economic and political progress

In support of the latter, I remind myself that when a young and not so life-hardened Jewish iournalist named Theodore Herzl wrote his now famous "Judenstat", delineating the reentry of the Jewish People into the family of nations after 2000 years of homelessness, persecution and wandering, many thought him mad, delusional, out of his idealistic mind!

Well, here we go again. Does Jordan's current rapprochement with Israel signal the possibility of a widening circle of mutual trust and peaceful Arab-Israeli co-existence in the Middle East? Unfortunately, Gaza, Iran, Syria, Isis and a whole host of revolutionary, dominationseeking Moslem entities in the world today do NOT have the mind-set and/or goal orientation of today's Jordan! Is a break-through possible on the near horizon?


