



HHBJC Wins Solomon Schechter Award

The Solomon Schechter Award rewards extraordinary characteristics and certain unusual and outstanding aspects or achievements that go beyond the expected norms. Award winners deserve recognition for the originality and quality of their programs, for their presentations and achievements.

Given biennially at the USCJ Convention, Solomon Schechter Awards recognize extraordinary achievement in various aspects of congregation life, including:

Torah and Tefilla (Learning and Prayer)
Kehilla (Sacred Community)
Israel Education, Engagement and Advocacy
Prophetic Voice (Repairing the World)
Community Embrace (Inclusion)

Hollis Hills Bayside Jewish Center has been awarded a 2017 Solomon Schechter Artisan Award. This award recognizes congregations for innovative initiatives that transform the

dynamic experience of Conservative Judaism. Our submission highlighting our *Congregational Nurse and Chesed and Health Fair* initiative was chosen by an international committee as an exemplar of this goal in the Kehilla (Jewish community inside and outside the walls of a synagogue) program. Our congregation was only one of two out of 51 congregational programs from around the country considered in this category. In all there were only 12 congregations recognized nationally in all of the categories out of 190 congregational programs.

This is a wonderful validation of the efforts our Chesed Chair, Laura Brodsky and her committee – a committee that can continue to grow with additional participation; helping those in the community with losses, health crises, or family challenges. In addition, the efforts of Linda Liederman, who stepped forward to become our congregational nurse, deserves our thanks for building what is now a national

From the Desk of Rabbi David Wise

Don't Be Quick To Judge



If you lived in abject poverty, how would you interact with your

neighbors? Would you find ways to live in cooperation so as to maximize whatever resources you have, or would you live in a manner of social Darwinism, doing whatever it took to be the most fit so as to survive?

Over the summer, I read reporter Katherine Boo's striking 2012 book *Behind the Beautiful Forevers*, a narrative about life in one of Mumbai's undercity neighborhoods. Annawadi is a makeshift settlement just beyond the luxury hotels that service travelers into Mumbai International Airport. Boo tells the stories of a number of Annawadi's residents and their struggle to both survive and lift themselves up and out into more permanent housing.

In this extraordinary account, we learn about Abdul, whose career path brings to life the adage that "one man's trash is another man's treasure." He deals in recyclable garbage, and has been moderately successful—he helps his family survive—until he is accused of

a crime involving a handicapped neighbor. Asha is the slum's "fixer;" as the unofficial slumlord, she seeks access to greater levers of power. Her methods of striving for such power are, as the reader discovers, shady and shameful. Asha's daughter, Manju, is both the most beautiful and educated of all the girls in Annawadi; if she can juggle both her rote learning and household chores, she might go to college. Everyone in the neighborhood is beset by unspeakable challenges; as Boo tells the story, in 2008, added complications arise. Terror and global economic recession stunt the city's growth, and plans for the government and developers to bulldoze the slum hang over the heads of all who call Annawadi home.

Many of the men in *Behind the Beautiful Forevers* are often too drunk to contribute anything useful. Some of the boys, shut out of the garbage trade, resort to theft. Some of the younger girls are consigned to the same kind of arranged marriages that once trapped their mothers; one such girl takes matters into her own hands with rat poison. The behavior of some of the people we meet in Annawadi shocks us. In her concluding paragraphs, the author notes that in conditions such as those in this book, "the idea of the mutually supportive poor community is demolished" (p. 254). All of our altruism—for those with an instinct to answer the question above by saying "all

for one and one for all—could easily fall by the wayside. So Katherine Boo's final assertion is a sobering reminder: "It is easy, from a safe distance, to overlook the fact that in undercities governed by corruption, where exhausted people vie on scant terrain for very little, it is blisteringly hard to be good. The astonishment is that some people *are* good, and that many people try to be..."

Thankfully, we live with solid roofs over our heads; whatever financial struggles we have are first-world problems. As I read *Behind the Beautiful Forevers* I tried to keep in mind Hillel's teaching in *Pirke Avot* 2:5: "*Al tadin et haverakh 'ad shetagi'a limkomo*—do not judge your fellows till you stand in their situation." *Rosh Hashanah*, also known as *Yom HaDin*, is nearly upon us. It's enough that we are soon to be judged by God. Let's make sure we take it easy and refrain from judging one other; and if judge we must, let it be *lekhaif zekhut*, favorably, and with forgiveness.

Wishing you a *Shanah Tovah* and a judgment of vindication for life in 5778,

PUTIN SHMUTIN!!!???
